We know His voice and obey His commandments.






God Saves Daniel When He Prays

Daniel 6

The story of Daniel teaches us that prayer keeps us safe. When we pray and have faith in God, we don't worry and trust that God will save us from any danger.

Daniel was one of God's people, and he worked as a governor for King Darius. Daniel loved God so much. In the Holy Bible, it even says that Daniel kneeled and prayed to God 3 times every day!



Daniel was very successful, and the king loved him because he was the best of all his governors.

The king wanted to give Daniel a higher position than the other governors. They became jealous of Daniel and tried to find something that Daniel did wrong, but they couldn't find anything.



Then, they came up with a plan to get Daniel in trouble. They told the king to make a rule that no one could pray to God for 30 days. If anyone wanted something they could only ask the king, not God.



Anyone who did not follow this new rule would be put into the lions' den. They knew Daniel would never stop praying to God because he loved God so much.

The king gave the new rule, but it didn't stop Daniel from praying to God. Daniel did what he did every day: he went to his room, knelt and prayed to God. Daniel knew God was listening to his prayers.



The other governors saw Daniel praying and told the king that Daniel was not following the rule. They asked the king to put Daniel in the lions' den. The king was sad because he loved Daniel, but he had to follow the law and send Daniel to the lion's den.



But God saved Daniel! He sent an angel to shut the mouths of the lions because He loved Daniel.

God loves all His children. He cares for us and keeps us safe. We should never worry because we have a strong faith and obey God's teachings. We always pray to Him, and we know that God is always with us.



St. Mary the Mother of God in the Coptic Church

**Learning about St. Mary the mother of God in the Coptic Church
teaches us how we honor her and how much she loves us.**

St. Mary is the mother of our Lord Jesus Christ. St. Mary is the queen because she is the mother of the King of kings. The queen sits at the right hand of the king. For this reason, her icon is placed on the right of our Lord Jesus Christ's icon on the **Iconostasis**.



We ask for her **intercession**, which means we ask her to pray to the Lord Jesus Christ for us. He loves St. Mary very much and listens to her prayers for us.

St. Mary is the **Theotokos**, the mother of God. She is the queen, the mother of the King of kings, the mother of our Good Savior.

She is our mother, our intercessor, and is higher than all the angels and saints.



Our Coptic Church has many feasts for St. Mary, including her **commemoration on the 21st day of each Coptic month**.

On this day, we remember and honor St. Mary.

Our Coptic Church also has a fast dedicated to her name, where we sing many beautiful hymns to honor her.

After St. Mary's fast, we celebrate the feast of when her body went to heaven!

May the intercession of St. Mary be with us.

St. Mark Shares God’s Word in Egypt

Synaxarion of the 30th of the Coptic Month of Parmoute (May 8)


Learning the story of St. Mark teaches us about the Church Fathers. They handed down the faith unchanged through generations. We should also do the same and keep the teachings unchanged.

St. Mark was born in a city called Pentapolis in North Africa. He, with his father, Aristopolus, and his mother, Mary, went to live in Jerusalem.

While in Jerusalem, he met our Lord Jesus Christ and believed in Him.

St. Mark was chosen by our Lord Jesus Christ to be one of His apostles.

St. Mark’s mother believed in our Lord Jesus Christ. His father believed with the help of his son, St. Mark.



St. Mark's house was special because he welcomed our Lord Jesus Christ and the 12 disciples into his home. This was the first time the Lord Jesus Christ began the Sacrament of the Holy Communion.

His house became the first Christian Church in the world.

St. Mark went to tell others about God in the city of Alexandria, which is in Egypt. When he entered the city, his shoe was torn. He went to a shoemaker named Anianus to repair it. While Anianus was fixing his shoe, he hurt his finger.

Anianus shouted “O, ONE GOD.” When St. Mark heard these words, he saw it as a chance to talk to him about the One God who came to earth to save all people because He loves them. St. Mark prayed, and the wound was healed immediately.



Anianus believed in the Lord Jesus Christ and the faith. St. Mark baptized him and his family in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This was the beginning of Christianity spreading in Egypt.

St. Mark started the first church in Egypt. He ordained St. Anianus a bishop.

St. Anianus continued teaching the people the faith exactly as he learned it from St. Mark.




St. Mark was the first Pope of Alexandria, and St. Anianus was the second Pope. Today, our Pope is Pope Tawadros, the 118th Pope of Alexandria.

The Church Fathers have continued to teach the true faith until today.
