Theatre Terms and Conditions (T&Cs)

All participating churches **MUST** download, print, read the Theatre Festival T&Cs (from SF website theatre page), then get it signed and send it back to the SF Theatre Sub-Committee as per the instruction given in the T&Cs document. **Your submission is not valid** till the SF Theatre Sub-Committee receives the Theatre T&Cs signed.

Guidelines

- 1. Scripts **Must** be reviewed and approved by one of the Church's Priests and Superintendent
- 2. It must be taken into consideration that the performance represents great values and traditions that are drawn from our Coptic Orthodox Church spirit
- 3. The performance should be suitable for the intended age group that will be presented to
- 4. The production is **NOT** mandatory to be associated with the theme of the summer festival
- 5. Scripts should be written using appropriate language, wordings and no violence or hate
- 6. The storyline should **NOT** be in the form of a sermon or a lesson, the script should have a clear message and if it is telling a true story there should be no altering in the events being told
- 7. The use of flammable materials or heavy smoke is prohibited during the performance
- 8. Please make sure to follow the timing guidelines to avoid losing points

- 9. Scripts must be submitted to the theatre committee on the following email sfmelbdrama@gmail.com preferably one week before the specified deadlines for review and feedback:
 - a. Script Must be signed and approved by one of the Church's Priests and Superintendent
 - b. **Script should have a cover page showing** church name, play name, targeted audience age group, responsible servant name and contact number, script author name and director
 - c. Script will be reviewed by different servants to the judges panel on performance day
 - d. If there is a feedback by the reviewing servants from the theatre committee, the responsible servant from the church will be contacted via phone call/Zoom meeting to discuss recommended amendments to the script and will be asked to resubmit the script by the mentioned deadline
- 10. Participants' names to be sent a week before the actual performance day, with consent forms
- 11. All participants shall be registered with SF online system

COVID Normal (Out of lockdown)

- If the participating church is out of lockdown, the above-mentioned guidelines will be applicable
- Each team is recommended to record their play/project to be submitted in case of proposed lockdown or not permitted for live performance due to restrictions.

COVID Restricted States (lockdown – or Limited numbers)

- Each participating church to prepare a recorded play/project which need to be submitted by the mentioned deadline. Recording file Must be named with the Church Name and Age Group
- Recorded play/project shall be sent as a raw record without any editing or montage. The play should be performed on a stage, and to be recorded as a play (not a movie). No editing, sound effects or visual effects/backgrounds in allowed, as this will not meet the guidelines of a theatre performance
- All churches will have No Entry Limit for plays/projects to allow maximum participation from all age groups according to the permitted gatherings number at that time
- It is recommended to consider producing small sketches with 2 or more participants. This is applicable from Grade 4 Youth & Open Age
- Individual performances will be introduced for Grades 7 12 and Youth Open Age, projects must be checked by church servants and under their supervision before sending to the committee.



Competition Format

- The production can be (But not limited) in the form of short play or sketch.
- Scripts might include hymns and soundtracks.
- There is NO limit for the number of actors/participants, we encourage a teamwork between the kids to perform backstage, technology setup as well as acting (Covid-19 Restrictions limit applies).
- Please note that the mark for technology setup and backstage work will be given according to the kids' performance and work within the time of the play.
- The performance timing will be as following (for COVID normal)
 - o 20 min: setting and preparation
 - o 25 min: play time
 - o 20 min: backup and clearing the stage
- The performance timing will be as following (for COVID Restricted States)
 - o **25 min: recorded play time** (Live stream, recorded videos, or YouTube will be accepted)

If exceed the times above, deduction of marks will be applied.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Technical support and backstage work to be rewarded as follows:
 - The relevance of the props to the scenes.
 - o The importance of the light and sounds being used in servicing the story.
 - The quality of the murals/screen (according to the age group) and how they are all connected to the play.

Blocking and Staging (10):

 Actors and setting are always clearly visible; stage space is fully used; movement is purposeful and well-rehearsed.

Storyline (15):

- A story is presented with a clear beginning, middle and end, and with a positive message.
- Topical Scenes: all scenes are NOT NARRATIVE (no through-line of characters) but are creatively linked to the chosen topic, movement, song.... Etc.

Commitment (10):

Energy, focus, memorization, listening and reacting, engaging and teamwork.

Voice (10):

projection, clarity, emotional range, and expressiveness.

Characterization (20):

 Expressive, engaging and believable characters are created through movement, facial expression and gestures.

Production Elements & Technical Support (25):

• Thoughtful use of costume, props, set, lighting (if available) and sound; production elements are well chosen and suited to the performance.

• Preparedness & Overall Production Value (10):

 evidence of preparation; performance is polished and professional; smooth execution; does not exceed the time limit.
